NUTRITION CORNER:

Turkey Peppers and Hummus

Different colored bell peppers
Hummus

EDUCATION:

TURN PLAYDOUGH INTO A SCIENCE GAME ABOUT PRIMARY AND SECONDARY COLORS! COLOR MIXING ENCOURAGES CHILDREN TO THINK CRITICALLY AND DEVELOP A VARIETY OF CHARACTER TRAITS, SUCH AS COOPERATION, REASONING AND UNDERSTANDING. DURING THIS ACTIVITY CHILDREN WILL PRACTICE SCIENTIFIC THINKING TO PREDICT AND EXPERIMENT WITH CAUSE AND EFFECT. THEY MAY TRY TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF MIXING THE WRONG COLORS. THEY WORK ON VARIOUS FINE MOTOR SKILLS SUCH AS GRASPING AND HAND MANIPULATING. THEY EXPERIMENT WITH VARIOUS SHADES, PRIMARY AND SECONDARY COLORS. THEY ALSO ASK QUESTIONS ABOUT TINTS AND SHADES AND THEIR CREATIVE THINKING SKILLS WILL ENABLE THEM TO COME UP WITH NAMES FOR THEIR VARIOUS COLORS.

ACTIVITY:

DIVIDE PIECES OF PRIMARY COLORED PLAY DOUGH, RED YELLOW, AND BLUE.

- ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO USE THEIR FINE MOTOR SKILLS TO MANIPULATE AND ROLL THE PLAY DOUGH INTO BALLS.
- THIRD, HAVE YOUR KIDS COMBINE RED AND YELLOW TO MAKE ORANGE. COMBINE BLUE AND RED TO MAKE PURPLE. COMBINE YELLOW AND BLUE TO MAKE GREEN. NOW YOU SHOULD HAVE THREE PRIMARY COLORS AND THREE SECONDARY COLORS!
- FINALLY, YOU CAN EXTEND THIS ACTIVITY BY TURNING THIS INTO A GAME. HAVE YOUR KIDS GO AROUND THE HOUSE AND TRY TO FIND OBJECTS THAT MATCH THE PLAY DOUGH COLORS THEY MADE. YOU CAN ALSO ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO SORT AND CLASSIFY THE OBJECTS FOUND BY COLOR, SIZE, OR TYPE.
